Kiplinger's ranks Georgia College one of the top 100 values in public higher education in the United States.

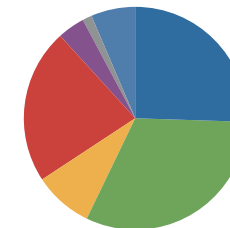
Georgia College ranks #3 in the state of Georgia in average SAT scores of incoming freshmen, behind only Ga. Tech and UGA.

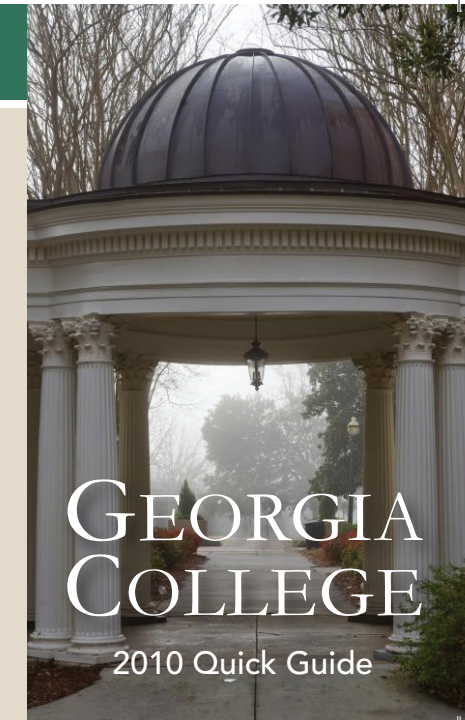
