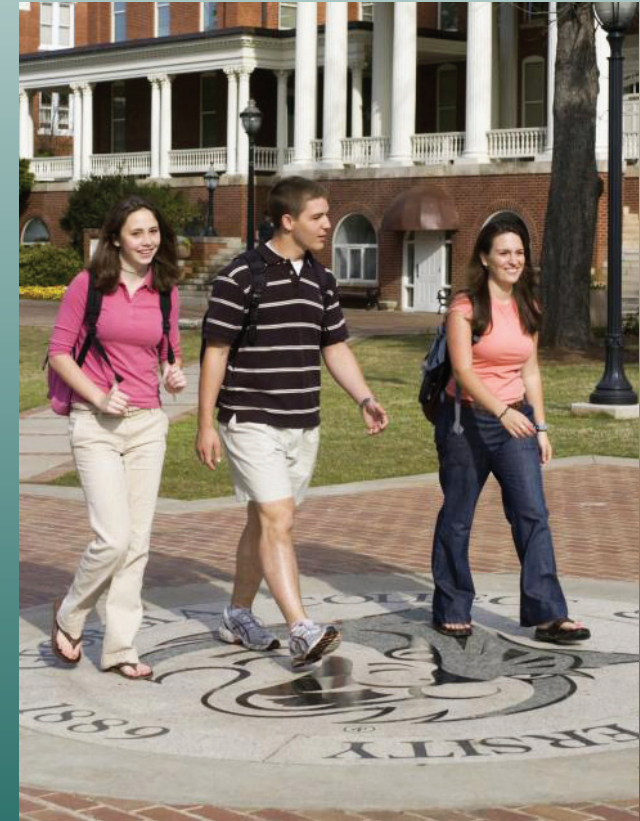

For the first two weeks in June you will be going to class, finding out what resident life is like, eating in our dining rooms, meeting our faculty and students, and learning to manage your newfound independence!

Why College Readiness Academy?

We want you to succeed in college!

It's not just being away from home that's challenging.

- Your classes will be different and more difficult than in high school.
- You will be in a new environment.
- You will have new and different daily responsibilities.
- You will need to learn to balance school, life, finances, social events and other priorities as you take this first step into adulthood.

GC's College Readiness Academy will give you the tools to do these things and more, whether you decide to come to Georgia College or not!

You will learn about all the standard services that colleges and universities provide for student success and learn how to use them to succeed in your first year away from home! College campuses are set up for you to succeed, and we want you to take your first step with confidence!

The Academics

You will be enrolled in two non-credit college classes, and for two weeks you will be engaged in college level academics with out-of-class assignments, in-class projects and presentations. You will also work within the community and on-campus creating, researching and completing your projects.

Explore the American food system on a national and local scale with our faculty chemist and sociologist duo, Dr. Metzker and Dr. Godwin.

Making new friends and interacting socially and academically can be daunting, but our public speaking class taught by Dr. Vail will help you transition into a new environment and give you the confidence to interact with your peers and mentors.

GC was recently rated the safest university in Georgia and one of the safest campuses in the nation!

Our program is conducted in a safe and controlled environment so that students feel comfortable and parents know their children are in safe hands. We have 24-hour live-in chaperones that are accessible to the students day or night. Our chaperones are current GC employees with previous camp experience. They are also CPR and first aid certified.

- 12:30-3:30 p.m.** Class: Animal, Vegetable, Human: *The Science and Sociology of Your Food.*
- 4-5:30 p.m.** Free time - Explore downtown Milledgeville, enjoy a cup of joe or work on out of class projects!
- 6-8 p.m.** Dinner and evening activity.
- 8:30-10 p.m.** Study time - our Library and Instructional Center or residence hall study rooms are available for study groups or project work.
- 11 p.m.** Chaperone checks and lights out.
