WRITING IN THE DISCIPLINES: HISTORY

THE BASICS

Historians research, analyze, and discuss theories about the past. Historians do more than just report on what happened, they also try to explain the why and how.

AUDIENCE

Historians write for the general public through books and film, as well as for students and scholars through textbooks and other academic writing.

QUESTIONS HISTORIANS ASK

- "How" and "Why" questions are usually the basis of their papers
- They might consider What happened? or Who was involved?
- Questions based on personal interest, relevance, and existing discussion regarding the topic

TYPES OF HISTORICAL WRITING

- Critical Essays
- Book Reviews
- Historical Essays
- Research Papers

TYPES OF EVIDENCE

- Primary: Pieces of evidence that would have been around at the time of the event
 - Examples: Photos, maps, speeches, diaries, and letters
- Secondary: Pieces of evidence that would have been made after the historical event occurred
 - Examples: Books and documentaries written and/or filmed by other scholars



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
