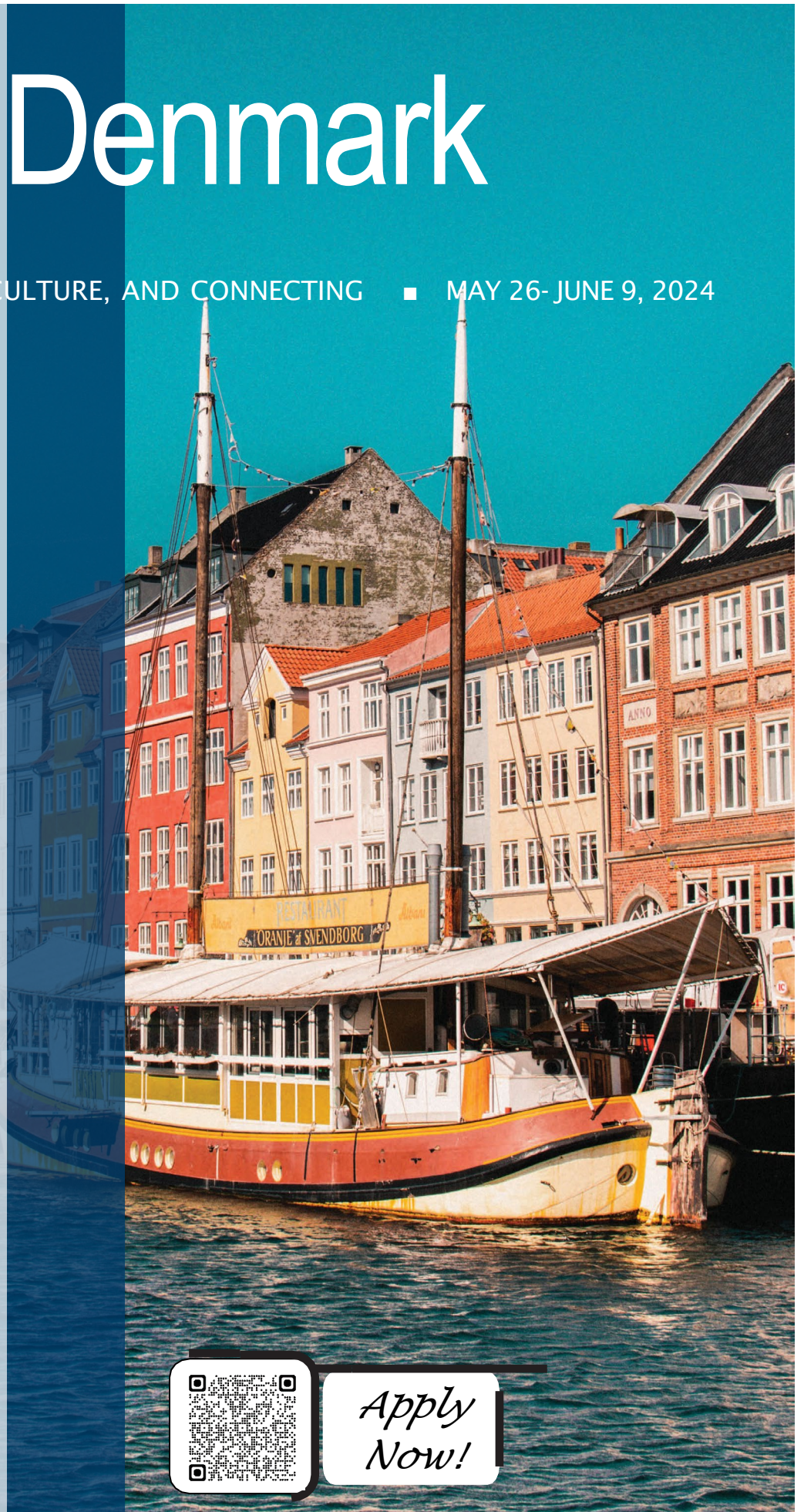

On this program, we will not only gain a global perspective on communications, but we will also experience the Danish concept of hygge or “cozy contentment.” You will encounter the differences between American media and Danish media which is dominated by the Danish Broadcasting Corporation, a large public service provider. We will see how U.S. politics and culture influence Danish media and also visit a variety of news and advertising organizations. Throughout the program, you will shadow reporters, meet with filmmakers, and learn from strategic communicators who really push the limits with provocative work.

You will also learn about Danish society and explore the rich history. We will visit Amalienborg Castle (home to the oldest monarchy in the world), the famous Copenhagen community called Freetown Christiania, the Danish Parliament, and more. We will also take a look at the unique tradition of højskole - a boarding school for adults who live and learn hobbies together. And, in addition to amazing Danish pastries and other local specialties, you can look forward to a few extra stamps in your passport as we take short excursions to Malmö, Sweden and Flensburg, Germany. Join us to get a first-hand, unique insight into Danish communications, daily Nordic life, and the hygge happiness of Denmark!
