

USG Academic Program Authorization and Review Update

The University System of Georgia is currently updating the academic program authorization and review process for new submissions. Some of the critical components expected to be provided include (1) Labor and Market Data (local, regional, **state**, national, international), (2) Curriculum (occupational competencies, career competencies, experiential/high impact practices), 3) Fiscal (marketing and startup costs & plans, faculty redirect plan), 4) Risk Analysis (low enrollment, fiscal, faculty). These components will likely inform the 7-year review plan of existing programs. Regarding the process:
