The goal of the WBF Junior Board is *to preserve history through the past*. In order for your application to be considered, we ask that you write a brief narrative, using a separate sheet of paper, on a potential historic preservation or historic restoration that you feel is worthy of saving. Limit your essay to 500 words. Please discuss why you feel, historically speaking, that this site should be preserved and what you would do to accomplish this project. We also ask that you tell us something about yourself – (1) What do you plan to pursue as a career? (2) Why do you want to become a member of this prestigious Board? (3) What do you think you can contribute to this Board? (4) Why should we select you for membership?

**Responsibilities of the Junior Board:**

The Junior Board devotes many hours of time to site visits, meetings, interviews, and research in the field of historic preservation in the Middle Georgia area. It is the responsibility of each Junior Board member to become actively involved in the project nomination and grant decision process. A certain commitment is required of the members to remain on the Board. **This Board may never be used as an excuse for incomplete school assignments or absences from school. Please note that sophomores-seniors are the grades eligible for membership.**

At least one overnight site trip may be planned during the school year and scheduled around school activities. This stay is paid for by the Watson-Brown Foundation, with the exception of each member's personal spending money. Gas for site visits and monthly meetings is reimbursed at a rate of forty-eight cents per mile.
