Applicants to Leadership Georgia College will be evaluated on the basis of their potential for professional and civic leadership, giving particular attention to the following:

1. Thoughtful commitment to leadership that connects the applicant's work at the university to professional and civic networks beyond Georgia College.
2. Demonstrated interest in leadership, civic affairs, and public life.

Requirements and Conditions for Eligibility

Applicants should have maintained consecutive full-time employment at Georgia College for at least twenty-four months. All full-time staff members are eligible to apply, provided they have maintained at least twenty-four months' unbroken service at the university.

Selection and Participation

Members of Leadership Georgia College will be selected through an application process commencing in January. Dossiers should include the following items.

1. **Letter of Application.** A one- to two-page letter of application should address the applicant's interest in connecting their field to leadership, civic affairs, and public life.
2. **Resume or CV.** Applicants should provide a current resume or CV, detailing their professional experiences.
3. **Letters of Support.** The applicant should provide two letters of support, emailed directly to leadership.programs@gcsu.edu. One letter should come from the applicant's current supervisor at Georgia College, (a) verifying that the applicant met or exceeded expectations in their last performance review and (b) offering support for the applicant's participation in the program.

A selection committee, chaired by the director of leadership programs, will offer to the university president a slate of recommended participants, and the President's Executive Cabinet will make the final selection. Applicants will be notified of selection decisions in February.
