The idea is to award one of the most valuable resources of all – time. The time is used to write one’s scholarship or prepare a performance or exhibition. The goal is to increase the scholarly productivity of Georgia College faculty by making additional resources (i.e., time) available. By increasing our dissemination of scholarship through peer-reviewed/juried outlets, we will enhance our national reputation; and the higher education learning community will have an opportunity to learn about all the great research, creative work, teaching and learning that is occurring at Georgia College.

This program is not for initiating research. GC has internal grants to assist faculty research. This program is designed to provide uninterrupted time to complete a project that has been on the back burner for some time. Two New Programs to Support Prospective Students

Adopt an Admit Mentor Program: Admissions is compiling a list of admitted African-American and Latinx-Hispanic students with a goal of identifying mentors (faculty or staff) who will build a relationship and guide them toward enrolling at GC. The mentor will be asked to communicate with the student once or twice a month from February through May; connect the student to needed resources at GC (i.e. financial aid, advising); encourage the student to deposit and to POUNCE, complete Housing, and attend Orientation; and to simply provide a listening ear and support.

College Liaison Program: An admissions counselor will work with each College to work with department chairs on recruitment activities. The goals will be to develop departmental or college emails for sophomore/junior name buys (with an emphasis on undersubscribed majors); plan virtual events to highlight programs, faculty, and current students; plan campus events to promote the college/departments; keep colleges/departments informed of changes in Admissions; and plan opportunities for the colleges/departments to keep Admissions informed of updates, new initiatives, new programs, etc.
