While an 80% or higher response rate is desirable, 65% is the *minimum* for dependable results to be considered statistically significant. Research and best practice consistently show that the most significant factor in increasing participation in online student rating surveys is for faculty to **express and demonstrate** how the results are essential and used in making meaningful course change(s). The next most influential factor is to **set aside time to complete** the survey.
