- Application review/feedback by the Office of Grants and Sponsored Projects (OGSP) October 11-18, 2023.
- Deadline to apply through the OGSP October 24, 2023.

College of Arts and Sciences

- Continue to expand the capacity and scope of the Aquatic Sciences Center that incorporates faculty and student research, along with an entrepreneurial funding model (Pillars: Innovate, Engage)
- Embark on a new Writing Studies Program renovation of first-year writing courses with an eye towards building a foundation for future-focused curriculum; to this end three new faculty were hired to improve GCSU's approach to writing studies. The college will be doing some strategic thinking about writing for the future. (Pillar: Innovate)
- Review graduate programming to boost enrollment in existing graduate programs (Pillar: Innovate)
- Collaborate with CTL to provide opportunities for faculty to be more engaged in teaching workshops, including seeing if there are opportunities to work with CTL to improve teaching, which could include acquisition and integration of new technologies (Pillar: Innovate)
- Expand and develop collaborative partnerships within the community (Pillar: Engage)
- Work with COAS Alumni Advisory Board to strengthen the relationships between the college and our
