SACSCOC 10 Year Reaffirmation

Congratulations to all members of the GCSU campus community for a highly successful 10-year reaffirmation with SACSCOC! The university passed all accreditation standards and the QEP without any recommendations and no requests for additional or follow-up reporting. As President Cox noted, that is the best possible outcome for the reaccreditation process and speaks directly to the hard work, dedication, and collaborative teamwork at GCSU.

While on campus, the on-site reaffirmation team frequently complimented our faculty, staff, and students whom they described as "genuine" and "enthusiastic for GCSU." The visiting team shared their admiration for our beautiful campus and facilities and thanked us all for our overwhelming hospitality. Additionally, we received strong support for our QEP, *Bobcats FIRST*. The committee noted these significant strengths of the QEP:

"The QEP addresses a topic of great importance for student success; there is broad-based support from students, faculty, and university leadership; assessment plan outcomes are well-defined and measurable; existing resources (such as Wellness Center and Serenity Den) are leveraged to strengthen the project; and there is admirable cooperation and synergy between Student Affairs and Academic Affairs."

Thank you to the entire university community for an enormously successful reaffirmation and on-site visit. While these results are preliminary, they are very favorable and indicate our successful reaccreditation which will be formally announced at the SACSCOC Annual Meeting in December 2024, in Austin, Texas.

Updated Student Absence Procedure

If students are participating in a university sponsored event (i.e. class trip, athletics, RSO activity), the faculty mentor or instructor should complete the <u>Request for</u> <u>Student Absences</u> form for the group.

The form *requests* that each student's professors excuse them from class, with the understanding that the work will be made up. Absences should be kept to a minimum.

Absences requested for RSO activities necessitate additional approval by the Office of Student Life, who will ensure each student is in good academic standing before approval.
