Spotlight on Georgia College History by Dr. Bob Wilson



GCSU is fortunate to have many of our campus buildings named for distinguished faculty and administrators. One of the best examples is the Maxwell Student Union, often called by students simply the 'Max." Few probably know that the "Max" commemorates one of the most popular teachers that ever graced our university—Mary Thomas Maxwell. Ms. Maxwell came to GSCW in 1936 from her home in Elberton. She taught in the English Department, but her administrative talents led her into campus-wide roles. For many years, she supervised student teaching, and from 1952-1956, she served as Dean of Women.

Maxwell was passionate about teaching and a colleague remarked that whatever course she taught, she made it her own. She had a special interest in George Bernard Shaw. She was the only child of Thomas Martin Maxwell and Janie Hulme—the Thomas in her name was her father's first name. She was popularly known as "Tommie" but the students would never call her that in person. To the Jessies, Ms. Maxwell was the embodiment of poise and grace. She combined a quick wit with gentility, and to quote another faculty member, she "personified the spirit and ideals of the college." She provided a role model for her time and was especially interested in helping freshmen girls successfully navigate their new surroundings. Maxwell lived in Beeson Hall and never married, though many of the students thought that she and an equally popular English professor, Ed Dawson, would tie the knot. Among her many activities, Tommie Maxwell advised The Corinthian, the student literary magazine. In 1944-45, the student editor of The Corinthian was Mary Flannery O'Connor, and the accompanying picture shows Mary Thomas Maxwell standing just behind O'Connor.
