# PRE-PHARMACY RESOURCES

This handout is designed to provide students a general guide to applying to pharmacy schools. For further assistance, please schedule an appointment with a Career Advisor.



# **QUICK FACTS**

Pharmacy school prepares students to become licensed pharmacists, equipping them with in-depth knowledge of medications, patient care, and healthcare systems. Pharmacy programs are extremely competitive. A **PharmD** is a **doctoral degree** and takes an extensive amount of work and school to complete.

Some things to keep in mind when applying are:

- Applications usually require some combination of these materials: minimum GPA, Graduate Record Examinations (GRE) scores, observation hours, letters of recommendation, a personal statement, a cover letter, and an interview. Thoroughly read through the requirements each school/program has for admission

- The <u>American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy</u> (AACP: <a href="https://www.aacp.org/">www.aacp.org/</a>) has several tables and directories that list out what most schools have as their average GPA of accepted applicants and can be viewed on the AACP website.

- **Shadowing or experiential hour requirements** are usually not part of the admissions process; however, having some experience in a pharmacy setting could help you be a more competitive applicant.
  - Check each program's page thoroughly for **shadowing or experiential hour requirements**.
- The **Pharmacy College Admission Test (PCAT)** is no longer a requirement for admission to pharmacy school as of January 10, 2024. Please check each programs website to see if there is a required entrance exam for their program.
- Your personal statement is limited to 1 page and should be general and not program specific because it will be used to apply
  to multiple programs.
  - PharmCAS states that your essay should address: Why you selected pharmacy as a career? How does the PharmD
    degree relate to your immediate and long-term professional goals?
- Some schools may require you to submit supplemental materials once you have submitted your application through **PharmCAS**.
  - Often the programs you selected will reach out to you once they have received your common application and request the additional information they want.
  - It is important to thoroughly read through each program's requirements to know what you need to have prepared.
- It is important to check each program's requirements on letters of recommendation.
  - Programs could require a reference from science faculty, a licensed pharmacist or practitioner, or a previous supervisor outside of academics.
  - It is ideal to acquire at least one pharmacist that you have shadowed or worked with, and most programs require at least 3 references.

## COMMON APPLICATION SERVICE (PHARMCAS)

- You will be submitting your application through a common application system, **PharmCAS** (www.pharmcas.org/) to apply to PharmD programs.
  - PharmCAS provides an applicant help center to make the process of applying much easier (help.liaisonedu.com/PharmCAS Applicant Help Center).
  - When applying through a common application service, they will forward your information to the schools you select.

## COMMON PREREQUISITES

English Composition I & II Principles of Biology I & II Principles of Chemistry I & II Organic Chemistry I & II Biochemistry Microbiology Human Anatomy and Physiology I & II Probability and Statistics Calculus

\*This is not an exhaustive list. Please research each program's requirement, and please consult with your academic advisor prior to registering for classes.

### **KEY NUMBERS**

- Minimum GPA: cumulative 2.5 or higher
- Average cumulative GPA range: 3.3 3.5

\*Check with each individual school for their GPA and score requirements.

\*\*Keep in mind that **quality outweighs quantity** when obtaining hours.

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### INTERVIEW PREPARATION

Several Pre-Pharmacy schools hold interviews as part of the admissions process.

When preparing for professional school interviews, a lot of the same rules apply as with most job interviews.

- Visit **Handshake** to view the Career Center's interview resources and handouts.
- **Practice ahead of time.** "Why do you want to be a pharmacist?" or "Why our program?" are common types of questions that you want to be sure and prepare for.
- Ensure you have **in-depth responses** to interview questions that are specific to you and how you fit into the program you're applying for.
- There are different types of interviews for pharmacy school that could include **speaking with current pharmacy students**, an individual faculty member, a current pharmacist, a panel of interviewers, or attend an orientation process.
  - To become more familiar with interview types and preparation, **book an appointment with a career advisor.**

# PRE-PHARMACY AT GCSU

At Georgia College, students interested in pharmacy careers can prepare for PharmD programs through a combination of coursework, advising, and campus engagement. Students from a variety of academic backgrounds can successfully pursue a doctorate in pharmacy studies with careful professional planning and advising.

GCSU offers a **Chemistry major with a Pre-Pharmacy concentration**, which is designed to help students complete the prerequisites needed for pharmacy school while gaining a strong scientific foundation. GCSU also partners with several pharmacy schools to offer eligible students majoring in chemistry an accelerated track to pharmacy school.
