# THE TIMELINE

As early as possible, alert your Chemistry academic advisor and UGA's College of Pharmacy of your interest in the Program. Enjoy priority applicant status, and receive a guaranteed interview during the UGA admissions process. Wait for an admissions decision.

Transfer credits completed in the PharmD program to fulfill a Georgia College BS in Chemistry.



### Years 1-3

Complete the prescribed pre-pharmacy coursework while taking advantage of the Georgia College experience, which is rooted in the liberal arts and provides an ideal foundation for a patient-centered healthcare career.

> Complete at least 35 hours of prerequisite courses in time to formally apply to the UGA PharmD program by September 1 of your junior year.



Matriculate into UGA's PharmD program where you will train to become a medication expert, managing and preventing drug-related issues. A dual MBA degree is available as well as others in Regulatory Sciences and Public Health.

Admitted students must **satisfactorily** (earn at least a C- in all courses) complete all 69 hours of prerequisite coursework and other requirements.\*
