

THE GEORGIA COLLEGE/ UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA “3+4” PRE-PHARMACY AND PHARMD PROGRAM



Georgia College Chemistry students have a guided pathway into the University of Georgia's Doctor of Pharmacy program and can receive a guaranteed interview. Those admitted to UGA will complete their bachelor's degree with transferred credits earned through the PharmD program, allowing participants an earlier start to their pharmacy career.



THE TIMELINE

As early as possible, alert your Chemistry academic advisor and UGA's College of Pharmacy of your interest in the Program.

Enjoy priority applicant status, and receive a guaranteed interview during the UGA admissions process. Wait for an admissions decision.

Transfer credits completed in the PharmD program to fulfill a Georgia College BS in Chemistry.

Years 1-3

Complete the prescribed pre-pharmacy coursework while taking advantage of the Georgia College experience, which is rooted in the liberal arts and provides an ideal foundation for a patient-centered healthcare career.

Complete at least 35 hours of prerequisite courses in time to formally apply to the UGA PharmD program by September 1 of your junior year.

Years 4-7

Matriculate into UGA's PharmD program where you will train to become a medication expert, managing and preventing drug-related issues. A dual MBA degree is available as well as others in Regulatory Sciences and Public Health.

Admitted students must satisfactorily (earn at least a C- in all courses) complete all 69 hours of prerequisite coursework and other requirements.*

WHY CHOOSE UGA?

The UGA College of Pharmacy is ranked 24th in the nation by U.S. News and World Report, and the pass rate for the North American Pharmacists Licensure Examination (NAPLEX) is #1 in Georgia and well above the national average. As a public institution, UGA provides the best PharmD education in the state at the most affordable price.

WHY CHOOSE GEORGIA COLLEGE?

The Chemistry program is ACS approved and has a long history of high acceptance rates for admission to pharmacy school.
