At Georgia College

- Notify chemistry academic advisor of interest in the program
- Complete prerequisite coursework
- Beginning in July of your third year, submit application for pharmacy school through Pharm-CAS.
- Participate in PCOM School of Pharmacy events and activities prior to matriculation.



At PCOM

- In year 4 or 5, students will transfer credits back to GC and earn their BS in Chemistry
- In year 7, students will earn their PharmD from PCOM

Articulation Program

- Georgia College chemistry majors will have an opportunity to enter pharmacy school after completing their third year. Following their second year of pharmacy school, eligible students receive their bachelor's degree from Georgia College, then continue in the program to earn a doctorate from PCOM.
- Guaranteed admissions for up to 3 Georgia College students who have successfully complete prerequisite coursework at Georgia College and have fulfilled the requirements for admission to the PharmD Program.

Advising

 Chemistry majors who have indicated their intent to apply for enrollment in the PharmD Articulation Program will have an opportunity to regularly meet with a member of PCOM's Admissions staff about the program.

PCOM Articulation Program Admissions Requirements

- Completed the prerequisite coursework with a grade of iC-i or better
- Average overall GPA is 2.9 and 2.8 for science GPA
- PCOM does NOT require any standardized test scores (PCAT, MCAT, DAT, OAT, GRE) as part of the application for the PCOM School of Pharmacy.
- Virtual or in-person interview

PCOM Early Assurance Program Admissions Requirements

- Georgia College first-year students who are enrolled full-time as achemistry major and meet program admissions requirements can receive conditional acceptance to the PCOM School of Pharmacy.
