

Is My Job a Rush?



Does your deadline for completion meet one or more of the following criteria?

- 1. Needed in 1-3 business days?
 - 2. Same-day or next-day?
- 3. Your event snuck up faster than expected, and you're submitting your request close to the event while still needing the project done in time.



OVERVIEW

- ✓ A print-ready file + short deadline is still NOT a rush (unless production capacity is maxed out)
- ✓ A new/non-print-ready project + short deadline IS a rush
- ✓ A print-ready file that still needs file prep becomes a rush
- ✓ Standard jobs follow their normal queues

CONSIDERATIONS WHEN SUBMITTING A RUSH REQUEST

Production Workflow

Rush jobs often require pulling designers off current work, rearranging already-scheduled designs, proofing and printing tasks.

Complexity

Rush jobs that are considered complex such as larger pieces, multi-page layouts, specialty sizes, multi-step finishing, or vendor coordination can extend the timeline, especially under tight deadlines.

Seasonal Volume

High-volume periods may impact the likelihood of a project being considered for rush accommodations.

Proofing Time

All projects require at least one proof; Faster timelines reduce the window for edits, approvals, and revisions.
