Spotlight on Georgia College History by Dr. Bob Wilson



Georgia College & State University recently received a nine-million-dollar gift from the estate of Dr. Gertrude Erlich, a 1943 graduate of GCSW. The gift provides need-based scholarship and housing support. Gertrude Ehrlich came to our campus in 1939 as one of the first international students, an Austrian refugee from Hitler. She went on to become a figure of national prominence in the field of mathematics.

Erlich's mentor at our college was Dr. Sara Nelson, one of our most distinguished faculty. Sara Nelson came from Oglethorpe, Georgia. Like so many rural girls from South Georgia, she was able to take advantage of the opportunities provided by our college. Sara was nurtured by Alice Napier, the woman who built our math department. Nelson graduated from Georgia State College for Women in 1926 with a major in mathematics. She joined the faculty in 1930 and worked for many years with Alice Napier to build a first-rate math curriculum. Sara's own area of interest was in projective geometry, although work in higher math did not preclude her from becoming a strong advocate for programs in math education. President Guy Wells supported Nelson's desire to pursue a Ph.D. at Cornell. She received her degree in 1939 in the field of algebraic geometry and algebraic analysis.

In the early 1940s, Sara Nelson took the reins from her mentor, Alice Napier, who was retiring. Like Napier and other faculty leaders, Sara Nelson was a staunch supporter of the YWCA and by 1945 was also serving as assistant registrar of the college. In the 50s and 60s, she took the lead in developing math and science workshops for secondary teachers, in response to the "space race" with the Soviet Union. As Dr. Edward Dawson, one of the authors of the history of Georgia College wrote, "...until her retirement in 1968, she was the guiding spirit of the math department and indeed of the entire woman's college." Her legacy is sustained through the math students who annually benefit from the Sara Nelson scholarship.

GCRA Group Listserv Reminder

The GCRA Executive Council uses the GCRA listserv to improve communication with retirees. We were forced to find a solution as increased email security features targeted the bulk messages from our individual email accounts to be marked as Spam or Junk. Options available through GCSU were limited and required us to meet University guidelines. While University Advancement was very accommodating in sharing messages, it wasn't a good solution. The listserv platform supports two-way group communication. Any

member may share relevant news with retirees. An update has been made on the Reply All options. It will now include the email address for the list and the poster. If you want to respond to the poster only, you can delete the list address.
