Welcome and Graduate School Updates: Mandy Jarriel, Interim Associate Provost, Director of the Graduate School

Overall updates by Dr. Jarriel.

- Paris is making targeted outreach calls related to applications & (“grad calls”) to answer student questions; the volume of these calls continues to increase.
- **New Graduate Coordinators:** Training is needed when individuals are new or transitioning into the role to ensure there are no gaps in student support.
- **Student Applications:** Students must verify that their admission/application information is accurate—especially those in Nursing or Education.
 - When students graduate, they must still apply separately if they enter a different program.
- **New Initiatives on the way:** Keep an eye out for more “Double Bobcat” options.

There are minimal to no comparable programs currently offered at the state or national level.

Support letters have been received from key stakeholders.

Targeted program launch date: Fall 2026.

Job market research has been conducted for positions relevant to this degree.

The university budget was discussed in relation to program needs.

Two new faculty lines are required for program sustainability; funding has been requested.

The Applied AI program differs from traditional fields, and other disciplines may have the opportunity to integrate or cross-list some courses.

The MMIS program may share some overlap; a potential combined degree could be developed in the future with additional planning.

Admission requirement: Any undergraduate degree (program currently offered fully online).

A certificate option will also be available to support students or professionals who seek AI application training without pursuing a full degree (“AI Ready” type option).

Middle Grades M.Ed. Program Deactivation – Andrea

Andrea provided an update on the planned deactivation of the Middle Grades M.Ed. program due to consistently low student enrollment.

The program’s highest enrollment reached around eight students, but it has recently struggled to maintain even two active students.

The department has been asked to proceed with deactivation of the program.

One remaining student will complete the program under a Teach-Out Plan, and no new students have been admitted within the past 12 months.
