### Watermark Student Learning & Licensure (SLL) Demo

Hierarchy

Can build rubrics into GCSU level or department level

Standards and outcomes: build in standards

Rubrics:

\*\*Cross-mapping of standards

Assessment projects

\*\*Connection between SLL and GaVIEW

- Integration uplink. Inserts SLL interface into D2L; feels like it's part of D2L but it's collecting data in Watermark
- Rubric assessing and grading can be separated (if you want to touch the assessment twice)

\*\*Internships:

- Students can enter time from field placement. Can they also write their reflections there instead of on paper in binders? Issue of confidentiality.
- Can keep track of mentors/PTs.
- Can assign placements, content areas, notes (student facing and non-student facing)

As faculty build out assessments, they will be able to see faculty view and student view

Gateways: can track students through various milestones, pre-admission through each year of program (gpa by semester). Provides students and faculty with common view.

E-portfolios:

- We can build out pages with components
- Can make the students' portfolio public facing by creating a URL to share.

Watermark does not delete any of our data as long as we are paying customers.

Permissions can be configured in a way to give more or less access.

GACE:

- Our overall pass rate on GACE dropped from 98 to 94%. Raised a few eyebrows.
- We may need to follow up with some programs to see if there is room for improvement.
- Things to think about:
  - Secondary Education: a pedagogy-only program yet students take content specific GACES. Then, GACE scores are not a true reflection of the program.
  - If we change admissions so that we only accept students who have passed the GACE, the pass rate will be close to 100% but our graduate enrollment will decline.
  - MG: If students take GACE content assessments prior to entering the program, then again, the scores are not reflective of our program.
- GACE pass rates per program are now publicly available on the PPEM public facing dashboard.
- **Miriam: students to teach provisionally must pass the GACE first. Or they provide waivers (don't get state funds with waivers)**
- **Let's ask PSC:**
  - When do GACE data get reported? When did they pull data?
  - Where?
  - Do newer cores replace older scores? How does that factor into our pass rate?
  - Are GACE scores tagged to GC before students are admitted?
- Percentage of students we are enrolling with GACE scores vs. UG degree vs. 21 credit hours.
- Pedagogy only program – what did they have to submit for PRS-II?

Please help us think through the standards that we need to send to Watermark to load into Student Learning & Licensure. Make corrections as needed.
