This award is unique in that it is the first grant award to a graduate student. This project will study the decline of grassland birds through understanding the effect that habitat changes have on reproductive success.

Marissa Mayfield, first year graduate student of **Sam Mutiti, PhD, Biological and Environmental Sciences** received a 2019 NSF Graduate Research Fellowship. This is the second fellowship of its kind in recent years for Georgia College and the Department of Biological and Environmental Science.

2018-2019 Tenure and Promotion

The faculty presenting dossiers for tenure and/or promotion this year excelled in the classroom with innovative pedagogy. Some faculty became *Quality Matters* certified to enhance their teaching. The 2018-2019 Tenure and Promotion applicants collectively published more than 75 peer reviewed articles (some with GC student authors). Additionally they published a number of book chapters. Faculty mentored students who received NSF funded Research Experiences for Undergraduate Research (REU) and served as reviewers for many peer-reviewed journals. Some were Editors or Co-Editors of journals. This year's group of 22 faculty excelled as teachers, scholars, and in providing service to GC, the community and their profession.

Women's Leadership Fellows Program

Georgia College is establishing a *Women's Leadership Fellows Program* to provide a selected group of faculty and administrators an opportunity to gain leadership skills and deeper understandings of the challenges and opportunities confronting higher education. Participants will develop the skills to explore their professional vision while learning how to become champions of equity for women in higher education.

The inaugural cohort begins in November 2019 and runs through May 2020. Fellows will attend monthly meetings where they will learn from senior administrators on campus as well as visiting speakers from academia, business and other fields. The program also features a concluding weekend retreat.
