Effective December 15, 2019, a critical hire justification narrative will be required for approval to move forward with any searches for full-time vacant or new positions budgeted at \$40,000 or more annually. All fund sources apply. To begin all relevant searches, please complete the *Critical Hire Form* which can be found on the GC Forms Page: https://intranet.gcsu.edu/faculty-and-staff-forms/university-required-forms.

If you have already posted a position and are in the midst of a search, you are exempt from this process.
