

Ed Bullard

Ed Bullard was elected Chairman of the Board of Greene County Board of Commissioners in November 2012 for a four-year term. The Board of Commissioners is the governing authority for the county with overall financial accountability and oversight of all county offices.

Previously, Ed was the government affairs executive in Washington DC with the Hamilton Sundstrand Corporation, a division of United Technologies. In this role, he was responsible for all marketing activities in the region and was the lead federal lobbyist for the company dealing with members of Congress, the Senate and the executive administration.

Prior to this position, he performed a similar role with Chrysler Technologies and the Raytheon Corporation.

Ed was a career Air Force officer culminating his career as Commander of the Presidential Airlift Wing, the home of Air Force One. He is a decorated Vietnam veteran with over 700 combat hours and two Distinguished Flying Crosses among his several decorations. He additionally served as the program manager of a major Air Force Weapon System with overall responsibility for logistics support and sustainment.

Ed graduated from the University of Oregon with a Bachelor's Degree in History and subsequently earned a Master's Degree in Political Science from Auburn University. Additionally, he spent one year as a Research Associate at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, a jointly administered graduate institution of Tufts University and Harvard University.

Ed and his wife Dolly first came to Greene County in 1996 when they purchased a retirement home in Reynolds Plantation. Upon retiring from United Technologies in 2007, Ed and Dolly moved to Reynolds Plantation where they currently reside. Ed served as Chairman of the Citizens Involvement Committee of Reynolds Plantations where their mission is to provide informed and factual information of county government issues that affected its members.
